WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

Our customer brought this 10 year old boat in with upholstery that was in rough shape. We worked with them to pick colors, textures, and decorative stitch patterns for the vinyl as well as the new GatorStep marine flooring we did in the boat.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

There was soo much work that went into this project and our entire team had some sort of hand in this one. The Tige wake boats share a lot of similar techniques for upholstery as the automotive world and nothing was simply designed. It seemed as if they purposely tried to find the hardest way to do everything. This Tige Z1 is a 21' boat so there was a LOT of upholstery to be done here, including both dash panels which were designed like a high end sports car. There are also a range of different colors, textures, and decorative stitch panels in this design. Getting all the pieces out of this boat and then reassembling it is not for large or even medium humans! We also did the flooring on this boat using the GatorStep product.

WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

The client wanted to add a Sunpad to the bow of his Cruisers 520 express. He wanted comfortable lounging with an adjustable back rest, and additional seating along the sides for when he is entertaining many people on the boat. The middle sections match the designed Sunpad location, and we expanded onto the sides of the cabintop to provide the enlarged space for entertaining. We doubled up the track and zipper attachment at the bow to allow the storage cover to zip on to the same deck attachment.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

We were very pleased with the balance and shape of the design. We fit the main Sunpad in the designed area molded into the deck, but needed to remove the plastic cupholders that existed from the factory. We increased the thickness of the Sunpad so that we could put cupholder inserts directly into the cushions. The articulating backrests have a plastic support which allows for the cushion to be set at multiple angles. The cup holders were placed to be convenient when lounging in just the middle section of the Sunpad, or all around when entertaining.

This project was a complete redo from start to finish. We completely changed up the design and added diamond quilting to all the pieces throughout the project. The customer wanted to make this older Scout center console something unique and custom. He did not want to spend the money on a new boat, so he decided to have our team create the beautiful and modern interior he wanted for his last boat. He wanted this interior to mirror the newer style Scout and Grady White style boats. We feel this was accomplished as a team effort with our client and our upholstery team.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

This project is being submitted because the client of ours recently unexpectedly passed away. When we designed this project he and his wife both were so excited to do a complete makeover on their newly purchased Scout Center Console. We did everything on this job from Seadek flooring, building a new full cover, and doing a complete make-over with the custom interior. This boat was at our service building for nearly 6 weeks during this process, and we don't know if there was a day that went by when our customer wasn't at his boat just playing around with it, or just hanging out watching us work and telling us stories of his boating life. What really sets this project apart from anything we have ever done in the past is that the customer assisted us with ideas and creative thoughts to help us together build something special for them. We believe the diamond detailing and two-tone accent throughout made this job turn out so beautiful and working together with our customer made it extra special!

If this job were to win an award our team would like to present the award to his wife as a token of our gratitude of having the opportunity to work on his boat. We are honored to call him one of our best customers and friend for over the past 10 years. It was going to be their last boat, and we are saddened that he was only able to enjoy the refinished boat for only 3 months before he was called up to heaven.





To do this we incorporated some quilting and darker color to the boat. We hand-sewed all of the quilting patterns. We designed this project with comfort being the first at utmost priority, but we also wanted this boat to stand out amongst all the other Sea Rays on our waterways! The client wanted firm foam on all the seat bottoms so we were able to re-foam the entire boat while we upholstered this job to help provide the comfort they desired.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

This customer let us use our design ideas and come up with a design that we felt would provide the desired "Wow Factor." We asked them for their input but they told us, "you are the professionals, so make it look great! We were a little nervous doing this, but our CAD team and our upholstery team worked hand-in-hand to help create a project that would deliver the satisfaction we were looking for. The amount of detail and design involved in this project is the main reason we entered this job for our customer. There was a lot of time in sewing all of the diamonds; hand-stitching not with a CNC sewing table. We have worked for this customers for nearly 15 years, so we would love to show them their boat was showcased at the MFA National Conference!

WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

This boat was in Florida for a few years without a cover. The foam was bad and the interior had become completely sun damaged. This project became a total overhaul.

Quilting has become the new trend with interiors. However, this customer wanted to keep things somewhat simple, and not draw too much attention. The customer wanted to update some of the original look and design for this cockpit interior. Together we came up with a design that was modern; an interior that would really make this boat "pop" when it was complete.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

The two-tone pattern layout on this project helps make this project really stand out. We used the same block embroidery that Everglades boats used on their previous upholstery to help maintain a portion of the original look and design. We mixed in some new colors bringing new life. This entire project also required all new foam shaping which demanded a lot of detailed labor to recreate a newer version of an aged Everglades Center Console.

WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

The client requested to have the whole fly bridge reupholstered with a modern custom design that included a lounger. They also requested matching mezzanine seat cushions and asked if there was any way we could make the fighting chair more comfortable. The client wanted a double diamond pattern and we worked with them to select the grey vinyl with blue thread.

Since all of the old upholstery was shot, we had to build the new cushions from scratch. The helm seats were shaped by kerf cutting the foam and supporting the gaps with foam wedges to create a shape that matches the complex curves of the seats. The curved lip on the knee lift and the top of the mezzanine seats were all cut and shaped by hand. The fighting chair seat cushions were new designs with a hidden frame for the seat back.

The addition of the lounger on the bridge involved fabricating a removable backrest that bolts into the existing cup holders on the boat. We built the core from starboard, to give it rigidity and weight. Once installed, it turns the bench seat into a perfectly comfortable lounger with 3 cup holders.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

We are submitting this project because the design and execution far exceeded our client's goals and expectations. Our client requested double diamonds and left the rest of the design up to us. The lounger is as comfortable as it looks. The height is perfect for resting against, with a slope that allows you to relax with your feet up. The three cup holders are perfectly placed for easy reach from the helm. We made the double diamond pattern in CAD and plotted it onto the vinyl to guide our sewing. The seat backs for the helm seats have the Ocean Yachts logo embroidered with the double diamond pleating tying perfectly into the design. The marlin logo embroidered into the back of the fighting chair is an exact match of a similar design that was etched into the foam flooring. Our client could not be happier with the results, and we agree!

WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

For this job, the client requested that all of their exterior upholstery be recovered with a modernized design. There were two known pieces of upholstery with wood rot, so we knew those would need to be replaced. We suggested the materials, colors, and diamond pleating pattern. When we started the job, we quickly realized that not two, but the ENITRE job needed to be rebuilt from scratch, including new foam. The rot was so bad that none of the old wood or foam was reusable as a pattern. So we began fabricating everything from scratch using 1/2" PVC. Once the new seat frames where built, foam was applied, and then each piece was patterned. We utilized our curved diamond pattern, ensuring that the tips of the diamonds followed the curve exactly. Once everything was made, we installed it and the client could not have been happier!

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

We are submitting this project because it was the most unexpectedly complex rebuild we have undertaken since we started the company five years ago. Each back rest consisted of a top and bottom frame base which had to align perfectly. There are complex curves present. The foam had to be cut and shaped to achieve the desired angles. Getting everything rebuilt correctly was a long and lengthy challenge. We are very happy with the design and craftsmanship we were able to achieve. French seams are perfectly straight, diamonds are consistent, and the fabric wraps the foam without pulls or wrinkles. Overall we are extremely pleased with this job, and the client could not agree more!



WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

Sonic 1900S was originally built in 1994 by Alan Faulconbridge, he bought it back in 2023 and refitted it over a 10 week period. The original name of the boat was Blue Thunder and he wanted a color scheme to reflect this. He also said "I want something over the top and so fancy that I could park it in my lounge." The owner supplied 2x race car seats for the helm and passenger seats which we fully customized along with upholstering the aft seat in the bespoke honeycomb design pattern.

We worked closely with the owner who supplied us with 2x race car seats that needed designing, foaming/padding then upholstering in the design the owner had envisaged. The CNC sewing was so complex it was sent to Japan to have the embroidery file done. Several mock ups had to be done first for the foam thickness to be at an optimum level for comfort and ergonomics.

WHAT ARE THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS?

This Upholstery Job was by far the largest I've ever done. It consisted of 93' of coming pads, 3 complex helm chairs, forward console lounge pad chair, full V-Seating cushions in the bow, an aft custom transom bench and tower seating. This customer requested that the seats be more comfortable than the original cushions and also requested to have a more updated and fancier look.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

This project was extra challenging for us, as upholstery is not our strong suit. We had to challenge ourselves to complete this project successfully. The foam on the entire boat was replaced and shaped with new foam, as all the existing foam was unusable. All the diamond pleating was hand drawn and stitched in house by hand. The bow V-Seating was especially a challenge to keep the diamond pattern matching the whole way around the bow. The tower seat bottom was extended to make for a more comfortable seat. The customer said he felt like he was always falling out of the seat. In the end the customer and us were very happy with the end result.



Our client requested a full reupholstery of his Malibu speedboat. We reupholstered the helm seat, knee-rise cushion, bench seat and back rest, the side panels, and the engine cover in high-quality EverSoft upholstery vinyl. We replaced the old, worn-out carpet flooring with Chilewich woven vinyl boat flooring. The foam was compromised in some of the cushions, so we replaced that as well with CushionRite Antimicrobial Seating Foam. We replaced the hull liner carpeting along the interior sides of the speedboat with Boat Blanket Material. Overall, seven cushions, plus the engine cover, were reupholstered in new vinyl fabric, the flooring was replaced, and the hull liner was replaced.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

This was a complete exterior upholstery and boat flooring makeover which took our team 3 weeks to complete, plus an additional 3 weeks of video editing. As a DIY supplier and how-to content provider, we had never taken on a full powerboat makeover project before. We were able to produce eight how-to videos for our YouTube channel teaching DIYers how to redo their own speedboat upholstery.

It was old, dilapidated in areas and didn't match their style or color preferences. Very dated feel to it. So we set up a consult appointment and talked through what they were looking for. They wanted the interior to feel homey and desired additional touches like matching pillows and curtains. They wanted the exterior to feel vibrant. However, they also wanted to ensure it all tied in together. They wanted something classy and somewhat timeless looking. We narrowed down their color preferences and worked with them to finalize their material selections. Then we asked questions and talked samples to determine a style that fit their ideal design. We did have to go back and forth on a few of the selections due to materials being out of stock or specific preferences (carpet) being discontinued. All in all, we built a perfect palette and design plan. Another concern was they didn't have a trailer for their boat and didn't want to have to pull it out of the water and rent a trailer. So the entire boat had to be gutted, measured, patterned and installed on-site at the dock it was housed in.

WHAT IS UNIQUE OR COMPLEX ABOUT THE PROJECT?

This particular project had to be done all off-site so was unique in the terms of planning, strategizing and dealing with outdoor elements and limited supplies. Virtually no room for errors without becoming costly mistakes considering the boat was nearly two hours from our shop. And it turned out flawless!
